



Director of the UN Millennium Project



On behalf of UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, from 2002-2006 Prof. Sachs chaired the **UN Millennium Project**, which was launched to achieve the **8 Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)**.

Prof. Sachs directed the Millennium Villages Project (MVP). From 2006-2015, the MVP achieved notable successes in raising agricultural production, reducing child stunting, and cutting child mortality rates.

Prof. Sachs' model for integrated rural development has been used by many other countries to help support antipoverty programs.



Leading SDSN to help countries achieve the SDGs



With his contributions to the MDGs, Prof. Sachs helped to promote the SDGs from their very inception. Prof. Sachs worked tirelessly behind the scenes and in public, to help forge a consensus for the adoption of the SDGs.

Under UN Secretary General's auspices, Prof. Sachs established the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN). Serving as the largest "think tank" to help countries achieve the SDGs, the SDSN now has over 1,600 member Institutions in 47 networks across 137 countries.

The SDSN has produced many highly influential reports, conducted academic studies, and hold hundreds of SDG-related meetings each year.



































Deep Decarbonization and the Paris Agreement

Prof. Sachs played a key behind-the-scenes role in the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement, participating in discussions between France, the United States and many other countries on the design and adoption of the agreement.

Prof. Sachs also led the highly influential "Pathways to Deep Decarbonization" report. Many countries have followed this research and formulated corresponding pathways.

These ideas are playing a larger role today, following the call by the Inter-Governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) for zero-net emissions by 2050.










Writing customized economic prescriptions for many countries




